ALS Subcommittee – Julie Jordan (Chair)

• Last month's meeting was cancelled; will meet after this meeting

Pharmacy Subcommittee – Mike Bove (Chair)

- Met on October 11th
- Revamped the agreement between hospitals and providers in regards to expired medications
 - Medications can now be returned after they have expired
- Asked hospitals to consider replacing Promethazine with Zofran
- Would like a vote to approve this revamped agreement
- Moved to approve Bob Breese, Seconded Dr. Thompson. Discussion? All in favor? Opposed? Abstentions? Motion passes.

Protocol & Policy Committee – Jeremy Cushman, MD (Chair)

- One action item and one discussion item to go over
- Action Item: SCT protocols were distributed for public comment
 - Major changes include the standardization of maximum doses for narcotics
 - Dexamethasone was added to the formulary not required for SCT units to carry
 - Motion to approve the SCT protocols Bob Breese, Seconded Dr. Katsetos. Discussion? All in favor? Opposed. Abstentions? Motion passes.
- Discussion Item: the committee has been busily reevaluating protocols
- Would like to add Ketamine to the RSI formulary this would be beneficial due to constant shortages of Etomidate
 - Initially, Ketamine would be restricted to RSI providers to see how things worked out

- Due to shortages of Succinylcholine, would like to give RSI providers the option to also use Rocuronium
- Data for and against Lidocaine as a pretreatment for RSI is dubious at best
 - Seems as though the majority of providers are no longer providing Lidocaine as a pretreatment for RSI reasonable given the data
 - Entertained motion of removing Lidocaine pretreatments from the field RSI protocol
 - SMH uses Lidocaine for head trauma
- These changes would have to go to the State for approval
- Facilitated extrication protocol has been added also uses Midazolam and Ketamine
- Please review the determination of death and termination of resuscitation protocol
- Everyone needs to understand what these protocols do and don't say
- Dopamine is no longer the best pressor; Norepinephrine is the best pressor
 - Significant advantages with Norepinephrine both in its efficiency and modality data
 - Better from a mix and administer perspective milligram per minute kilograms are removed from the equation
 - Would like physician feedback re: this
 - Would like to change from dopamine to norepi as our pressor provided we can get it, standardize it, and get it approved by the State

Quality Assurance Subcommittee – Manish Shah, MD (Chair)

- Membership for next year: Kevin Clark & Sarah Sanderson are rotating off
 - Thanks to both for their service to the committee
 - New Members: Matt Rudow & Alex Dulan will begin as of January 1st
- Regionalization Committee Chair was excluded from the new policy & procedure document approved by this group at the last meeting
 - Motion to amend the document Bob Breese, Seconded Dr. Murray. All in favor? Opposed? Abstentions? Motion passes.
- Chart Lock Times will no longer be tracked by the QA Committee
 - The State now has their own policy and this will be followed
 - Any open cases due to Chart Lock Times will need to be completed

<u>Finger Lakes Regional Trauma – Bob Breese (Official Representative)</u>

- Met in October
- Discussed interaction with the State Trauma Advisory Committee and the fact that the American College of Surgeons does the verifications of trauma centers
 - They are looking for feedback from local hospital trauma centers when patients are transferred
 - Looking to develop an education piece for trauma center notification, education for prehospital providers
